Plan for the Concept, Topic, or Skill --- Not for the Day- (7-5.2)

Essential Question:	What can we learn about World War II from posters, music and speeches
Activating Strategies: (Learners Mentally Active)	Play songs from the World War II Era (Recommended CD "Songs That Got Us Through WWII- Rhino Records)
Acceleration/Previewing: (Key Vocabulary)	analysis
Teaching Strategies: (Collaborative Pairs; Distributed Guided Practice; Distributed Summarizing; Graphic Organizers)	Display Posters from the National Archives "Powers of Persuasion" Exhibit and discuss what they think each poster is trying to convey http://www.archives.gov/exhibits/powers_of_persuasion/powers_of_persuasion_home.html In groups of 4 distribute four (4) posters (use the poster deck of cards "Second World War 1939-1945 Historic Art Poster Playing Cards) have each student analyze one card using the National Archives poster analysis work sheet http://www.archives.gov/education/lessons/worksheets/poster.html One a set signal students should pass their poster card and analyze the poster passed to them. Each student should have analyzed four posters at the end of the activity Students should not talk during this activity (make sure WWII music is playing)
Distributed Guided Practice/ Summarizing Prompts: (Prompts Designed to Initiate Periodic Practice or Summarizing)	Each group should compare notes on each of the posters their group analyzed and come to a consensus about the group posters. Each group should choose a poster and its analysis to share with the class
Summarizing Strategies: Learners Summarize & Answer Essential Question	Students will write a summary of today's lesson including and answer to the Essential Question and the most important thing learned
